ORDINANCE NO. 832

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF WORLAND, WASHAKIE COUNTY, WYOMING, PERTAINING TO CERTAIN MOTOR VEHICLE AND TRAFFIC REGULATIONS BY REPEALING, AMENDING AND SUPPLEMENTING PORTIONS OF CHAPTER 14 OF THE WORLAND CITY CODE. ALL ORDINANCES OR PARTS OF ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT HEREWITH ARE HEREBY REPEALED.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF WORLAND, WASHAKIE COUNTY, WYOMING.

SECTION 1: Section 14-3 of Article I of Chapter 14 of the Worland City Code prohibiting Driving Under the Influence of Intoxicating Liquor or Drugs shall be and is hereby repealed in its entirety.

SECTION 2: The following definitions in Section 14-6 of the Worland City Code shall be amended to read as follows, to-wit (Amended Language in **Bold**):

IMPROVED PARKING An area used for vehicle, RV, or SURFACE: trailer parking, constructed of

trailer parking, constructed of cement, crushed rock, gravel, asphalt, or similar surface, which is free of litter, debris, weeds, or other objectionable material or objects. The surface must be at least as large as the vehicle parked upon it.

INOPERABLE **VEHICLE:**

A.Any motor vehicle which has a flat tire(s); or is considered as an unsafe vehicle; or by dismantling, disrepair or any other reason, is incapable of being propelled under its own power.

OPERABLE VEHICLE:

An operational motor vehicle must have its own battery, **no flat tires, be considered as a safe vehicle, and** be able to start and roll on its own power, and be able to be legally registered.

SECTION 3: Section 14-11(C) shall be supplemented by adding a new Subsection 3 and renumbering the present Subsections 3 and 4 to 4 and 5. Said new Subsection 3 shall read as follows, to-wit (Supplemented Language in Bold):

3. Within any alleyway. Any vehicle parked or left standing upon a street, alley, or public way in such a position as to obstruct the normal flow of traffic, or in such a condition as to create a hazard to other traffic or property, may im-

mediately be towed and impounded at the expense of the owner to an impound facility authorized by the Chief of Police or his or her designee. Reasonable efforts to contact the vehicle owner should be made prior to towing, given the situation is not an emergency.

Emergency vehicles, active construction vehicles and construction equipment, and other safety equipment or vehicles are deemed exempt.

SECTION 4: Section 14-12(A) and (D) shall be supplemented to read as follows, to-wit (Supplement in **BOLD**):

- A. No person shall leave any partially dismantled non-operating, wrecked or junked vehicle, or a vehicle without current registration on any street or highway within the city. Vehicles determined to be abandoned on a public street, may be towed and impounded in accordance with Wyoming Statutes Section 31-13-104.
- D. Unattached trailers in use at an active construction or work site, and traffic safety trailers, are exempt from this section and shall be deemed "stored".

SECTION 5: If any portion of this ordinance is held or found to be invalid, the remainder of the ordinance shall continue to be in full force and effect.

SECTION 6: All ordinances or parts of ordinances of the City of Worland in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

SECTION 7: This ordinance shall take effect and be in full force and effect on **APRIL 1, 2016**, after having been published in the Northern Wyoming Daily News.
