Chairman Anderson was present for the continuation of the meet-

Sheri Gunderson and Lila Jolley gave an update on Washakie County Prevention Coalition activities going on for the rest of the school year. They also advised further activities will be available online as soon as the site has been set up for community use. Gunderson advised that the TANF Grant funding has been given to all local counties instead of each county having to apply for the grant.

Superintendent Stuart Bower gave an update on Road and Bridge projects and road repairs that will be coming up during the summer months. He said there are several county roads that need updated with asphalt and that they are working on getting everything situated. A lot of the issues on some of the roads are not repairable as some repairs will create new problems. He advised the roads are a work in progress and that there will be Road and Bridge presence out there to get everything situated. It was discussed that the County will provide a culvert for County Road 47 in order to prevent further road damage caused by runoff. Bower updated the BOCC on the refurbished grader that should be done within the next week or so. A discussion was held on crushing locations and options. Bower advised that he met with Big Horn REA to discuss them utilizing the County's ROW on Big Trail in order to upgrade power lines. Chairman Anderson advised that the BOCC would like to have more information regarding the project with maps and photos etc.

Interim Planner Mike Robinson updated the BOCC on the new

trail system that is being drafted. Part of the current trail will be cut off due to it being on private property. The issue behind the areas on private property that are being closed off are mostly due to damage, trash and uncourteous public users which is unfortunate. Access to the Lone Tree Trail is still available.

Marsh enquired about the progress on the Blue Way Trail in Washakie County. Chairman Anderson advised that the County had a great project started but due to lack of a current full time planner and public concern, the project has been put on hold. Marsh advised the BOCC that he would like to lend BLM resources in hopes to continue the project forward.

A discussion was held about the rock on Mahogany Butte that needed to come down. Mike Phillips agreed that it was currently a safety issue and needed to come down, so he advised the county to go ahead and proceed with getting the issue taken care of. Bower said that Midwest Rock Fall will be on schedule for the week of April 10th to assist the county with getting the rock down.

Sheriff Brookwell advised the BOCC that he was able to hire a part time IT person for the Sheriff's office to be able to take care of their current needs. A discussion was held regarding security cameras for the courthouse and what options would be best for the county. He will be obtaining quotes to present as a whole to the BOCC. Sheriff Brookwell also said that he was looking into several options for a new vehicle as discussed in the last meeting. Commissioner Wolf agreed that now was a good time to get a vehicle ordered as it would be ready by the beginning of the County's fiscal year.

A motion to go in to executive session to discuss personnel with Sheriff Brookwell at 3:50 pm was made by Commissioner Wolf and seconded by Commissioner Martinez. Motion carried. A motion was made by Commissioner Wolf and seconded by commissioner Martinez to reconvene into regular session beginning at 4:00 pm.

County Attorney Anthony Barton gave an update on the OPIOID settlements. Barton also advised that as the last day to file an appeal to the Ambulance Bay Decision was April 3, 2023 and there had been none filed, the county was free to make a decision on the new Ambulance Bay. Chairman Anderson noted that due to the public interest he would like to wait and make a final decision at the next Commissioner's meeting on April 18th.

A motion to go in to executive session to discuss the Commissioner's Scholarships at 4:23 pm was made by Commissioner Wolf and seconded by Commissioner Martinez. Motion carried.
