WASHAKIE COUNTY COMMISSIONER PROCEEDINGS August 6, 2024

The Washakie County Board of County Commissioners met at the above date beginning at 9:00 a.m. Those present were Chairman Aaron Anderson, Commissioner Terry Wolf, Commissioner Morgan Martinez and clerk to the board Lily Rakness Parra. The meeting was opened with the pledge of allegiance led by County Clerk Rakness Parra.

A motion was made by Commissioner Martinez and seconded by Commissioner Wolf to approve the minutes from the July 23, 2024, meeting. Motion carried.

Road and Bridge Superintendent Stuart Bower presented the BOCC with quotes for a vehicle that needed repair. It was agreed that the lowest bid would suffice.

Building Maintenance Manager Breck Buer discussed Fairgrounds arena repairs that needed attention with the BOCC.

Road and Bridge Superintendent Stuart Bower gave an update to the BOCC. He advised that Jerry Kienlen and Holland Ranch would like to move a fence along their property that continually gets knocked down due to snow drifting along the fence line. It was decided that since the fence was not a county fence, the BOCC did not have an issue with it being moved as long as it didn't encroach on the right-of-way. Bower advised that his crew was in the process of continuing the grading process around the county as well as getting the remainder of gravel hauled around the county. A discussion was held regarding the bike path and the responsibility of the upkeep at the start of the path. A discussion was held regarding an email from Frank Decroo to Commissioner Martinez addressing the need for more fire lane signs around the county. Bower advised that he would work on the signs during the winter months when there will be more time for the crew to do so.

Interim Planner Mike Robinson gave an update to the BOCC. He advised that he is in contact with Mr. Anderson regarding the Ten Sleep Rock Ranch and the WYDOT and DEQ permits that need to be updated to allow for compliance with the Planning Commission. A discussion on the recent chip seal projects was held as well as a discussion on the overall condition of the roads throughout the county. Robinson discussed potential projects for maintenance on other county roads, and the necessity of seeing how quickly some are deteriorating as well as getting public input from property owners in terms of what they would prefer.

Building Maintenance Manger Breck Buer gave a building maintenance update to the BOCC. He advised that Washakie County Fair week was a success. Buer spoke to a few repairs that needed to be addressed at the medical building on 15th and Charles Ave. He advised that the fire alarm needed to be updated and will be obtaining quotes to do so. Buer advised that in regard to the earlier discussion about the bike path, he and his crew would get it cleaned up.

Sheriff Austin Brookwell and Captain Chris Hazen spoke to the

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BOCC regarding the life saving actions taken by Deputies Chad Carlon, Myron Chatwin and Travis Thatcher, as well as Worland Police Officer Rene Herrera. Sheriff Brookwell honored the officers in saving the life of an inmate who, after drugs had been smuggled into the jail, ingested the drugs and overdosed. He advised that because of the swift actions taken once the situation was discovered, the inmate made a full recovery. The officers were all awarded the "Life Saving Medal".

County Assessor Nancy Quinn presented the BOCC with the 2024 Valuation Report. She advised that there were no changes for Worland and Ten Sleep and that the real estate values did not have much of a change as well.

A motion was made by Commissioner Wolf and seconded by Commissioner Martinez to approve the 2024 Levies for Washakie County. Motion carried.

There being no further business to come before the board a motion was made by Commissioner Martinez to adjourn the meeting. Motion carried.
