A regular meeting of the City Council of Worland, Wyoming convened in the Council Chambers in City Hall at 7:00 p.m. on July 2, 2019. Mayor Jim Gill presided and the Councilmembers in attendance were Keith Gentzler, Kreg Lombard, Mandy Horath, Gary Gerber, Delayne Renner and Mike Neuffer via telephone. Also present were: Chief of Police, Gabe Elliott; City Attorney, Kent Richins; City Engineer Representative, Mike Donnell; Superintendent of Public Works, Brian Burky and Deputy Clerk Norma Homan. Councilmember Christy Schneider was absent.

Councilmember Mike Neuffer joined the meeting at 7:05 via telephone.

Mayor Gill stated that the August 6, 2019 Council Meeting will be at the Golf Course. The meeting will start at 6:00 p.m. and pizza will be available.

Mayor Gill stated that golfers have expressed the need for a new bathroom. Mayor Gill stated that he met with Golf Course Manager Mike Propp and Superintendent of Public Works Brian Burky to discuss the proposed project. Mayor Gill would like to budget \$25,000.00 to pay for the restroom. Mayor Gill informed the Council that the project would be managed and supervised by Superintendent of Public Works, Brian Burky. Councilmember Gentzler questioned when the project would start. Mayor Gill stated that there is no set date to start, but wanted to start with approval of funding. Superintendent of Public Works Burky added that it could possibly start in the fall.

Motion: to appropriate \$25,000.00 for construction of a new restroom at the Golf Course contingent upon approval of a budget resolution.

City Engineer Representative Mike Donnell reported that the GSB project is complete. The project included Richins subdivision, RJ subdivision, Sunrise Heights, Hillcrest, Sage Creek, South 17th and 12th Streets, and Culbertson Avenue; totaling 141,810 square yards. City Engineer Representative Donnell stated that they plan to continue to work with Schneider Construction to finish paving three intersections: 6th & Howell, 6th & Obie Sue and 6th & Grace.

Superintendent of Public Works Burky reported that a small project at the lagoon is complete; they replaced a few valves and replaced a leaky vault. City Crews replaced a leaking fire hydrant on 6th street with a new one. Tomorrow, the city crew will be putting in two new valves on the fire hydrant with the water shut off for about 4 to 5 hrs. Superintendent of Public Works Burky stated that the baseball tournament over the weekend had full attendance. The flags are up on main-street, new power outlets were installed for use by the Farmers Market, the free library will be up soon and the American Legion is putting up couple of horseshoe pits at the Veterans Park.

Chief of Police Gabe Elliott reported that the Gravel Pits at the Fairgrounds are open on the 4th thru the 7th for the public to shoot fireworks. Worland Rehabilitation and Healthcare will not be doing a fourth of July fireworks display this year.

There being no further business to come before the Council, Mayor Gill asked for a motion to adjourn.
